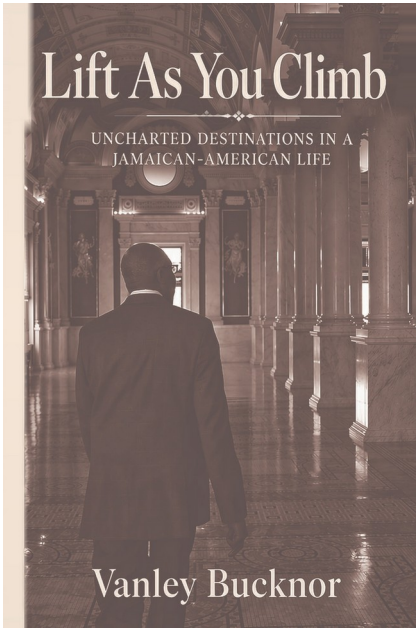

How teachers, family members, colleagues, supervisors, and quiet encouragers can change the direction of a life - and how gratitude becomes a responsibility to lift others.

Best suited for: mentorship programs, youth organizations, schools, professional associations, leadership groups, and community events.

Speaking Topics Continued

Migration - Leaving Is Only the Beginning

A Jamaican-American reflection on leaving home, beginning again, adapting to unfamiliar systems, and carrying memory, identity, responsibility, and belonging across borders.

Best suited for: diaspora organizations, immigrant communities, cultural programs, libraries, universities, and book clubs.

Leadership - Service Made Visible

Leadership as stewardship rather than status. Drawing from public service, Vanley explores listening, truth, trust, accountability, capacity-building, and the responsibility to make work humane and make other people bigger.

Best suited for: government, nonprofit and civic leaders, professional associations, leadership programs, workplace events, and public-service audiences.

Legacy - What Remains

A reflection on what outlives position: influence, example, public record, personal memory, family, mentorship, and the people who carry something forward because we were here.

Best suited for: leadership and retirement programs, family and community gatherings, libraries, book clubs, and reflective events.

Possible Event Formats

Format	Typical length
Keynote or featured talk	30-45 minutes
Author conversation / fireside chat	30-60 minutes
Panel participation	45-75 minutes
Library or book-club discussion	45-60 minutes
Podcast or media interview	20-45 minutes
Workshop-style reflection session	60-90 minutes

Sample Interview Questions

These questions give journalists, podcasters, event hosts, librarians, and book clubs a flexible way to enter the memoir while staying aligned with the five reflections.

1. What inspired you to write Lift As You Climb at this stage of your life?
2. Where did the title Lift As You Climb come from, and what did you recognize about your own life while choosing it?
3. How did growing up in Great Valley shape the values and outlook that carried you through later chapters of your life?
4. Who were some of the mentors, teachers, family members, or encouragers whose influence became clearer as you wrote the memoir?
5. How did migration to the United States change your understanding of identity, home, opportunity, and responsibility?
6. How did your understanding of leadership change over the course of your career in public service?
7. When you think about legacy now, what matters more to you than titles or positions?
8. What do you hope readers - particularly younger readers - will carry with them after reading the book?

Five-Reflection Conversation Route

For a shorter interview, questions 3 through 7 can be used as a direct route through Roots, Mentorship, Migration, Leadership, and Legacy. Questions 1, 2, and 8 work well as the opening, title-origin, and closing questions.
